Instructions for Individuals Taking CITI for the First Time

- 1. Visit www.citiprogram.org.
- 2. Click on the "Register for the CITI Course" link.
- 3. Select Organization Affiliation: Albert Einstein College of Medicine
- 4. Create Username/Password. You may use any email address you currently use.
- 5. You will then be directed to Select Curriculum. Select courses for Albert Einstein College of Medicine for "Animal Care and Use".
- 6. Check all the modules that apply for the species you are using (see below)
- 7. After you have checked all the appropriate boxes, Click "Submit" or "Next".
- 8. You will then be redirected to take the required training modules.

SPECIES SPECIFIC MODULES AND REQUIREMENTS

Mouse users must take:

- 1. "Working with The IACUC" which will appear as "Investigators, Staff and Students"
- 2. "Working with Genetically Modified Mice in Research Settings"
- 3. "Working with Mice in Research"

If survival surgery will be performed on mouse, must also take:

- "Reducing Pain and Distress in Laboratory Mice and Rats"
- "Aseptic Surgery"
 Both modules required for anyone performing survival surgery

NOTE: All 5 of these courses are required of incoming Graduate Students.

Rat users must take:

- 1. "Working with The IACUC" which will appear as "Investigators, Staff and Students"
- 2. "Working with Rats in Research Settings"

If survival surgery will be performed on rats, must also take:

- 3. Reducing Pain and Distress in Laboratory Mice and Rats"
- "Aseptic Surgery"
 Both modules required for anyone performing survival surgery

Other species:

- "Working with The IACUC" which will appear as "Investigators, Staff and Students" required for all
- "Working with Non-Human Primates in Research Settings" if working with non-human primates
- "Working with Rabbits in Research Settings" if working with rabbits
- "Working with Guinea Pigs in Research Settings" if working with guinea pigs
- "Working with Zebrafish (Danio rerio) in Research Settings" if working with zebrafish
- "Working with Amphibians in Research Settings" if working with amphibians
- "Working with Fish in Research Settings" if working with fish
